 Hi friends!

Let us do something interesting... I am going to do a science experiment. It is very easy and simple. Everyone can do it. It is called a Magic Balloon. Do not worry. You can do this experiment with your home kitchen items. But ensure you get help from your mother or father or an elder at home.

Here are the requirements.

- Small bottle with small mouth
- Baking soda
- Vinegar
- Balloon

Instructions:

Step 1: Measure 15 ml vinegar in a glass and pour into the small bottle

Step 2: Put 1 scoop of baking soda into the balloon.

Step 3: Fit the balloon to the mouth of the bottle. Take care not to let the baking soda fall into the bottle like shown below

Step 4: Now lift the balloon to let the baking soda fall into the bottle and see the magic

Science behind this: Vinegar and baking soda mix to form a chemical reaction that releases Carbon dioxide (CO<sub>2</sub>) gas which fills up the balloon.

Some kinds of fishes cough. In order to clear the particles and bacteria out of their gills, the fish's ventilation cycle is interrupted with a cough.

### FACT 2:

Like animals, bacteria do hibernate under unfavorable conditions.

Micro organisms may perceive their environment and adapt to it by sensing it and detecting it. They use a variety of survival techniques when they are in an environment where their natural food supply has run out. The generation of Endospores by bacteria is one such tactic, which is typically started in situations where there is a lack of food. Endospores, as the name suggests, are seed-like formations produced within the bacteria. They are extremely resilient, created to ensure survival and protect the genetic material when environmental stress is present. Endospores make survival possible for bacteria which would otherwise kill them in extreme conditions such as high temperature, pressure, chemical damage, radiation, etc.

## “TONGUE PRINT”

When detectives investigate a crime scene in any prime-time cop drama, they're often on the hunt for one thing: finger prints. There are a few things that make the tongue such a good candidate for identification. It has unique features which differ from individual to individual and even between identical twins.

First of all every tongue is different in terms of certain aspects like shape and texture. Also, it is the only organ actually housed inside the body (the mouth, to be more specific), but it can easily be stuck out for inspection. Also, sticking out one's tongue is an undeniable “proof of life”, whereas fingerprints and even irises can be mimicked or applied without the person's consent/consciousness.

Tongue prints are recorded with a high-tech digital camera.

The three in one sensors can reproduce images with the smallest details in varied, bright colours.

Then the information is digitized and processed through a unique diagnostic software.

Elephants are social animals, mostly found in groups, they mingle and supports their fellow beings.

An elephant has a very large brain. In fact, out of all land mammals, an elephant's brain is the biggest.  
Elephants are not only the largest land mammal but also possess the largest brain, weighing about 5 kg. Elephant brain is about three times larger the human brain containing about 260 billion neurons. About 97.5% of these neurons are present in the cerebellum, making them more specialized in sensorimotor abilities while there is only less number of neurons in the cerebral cortex making them less specialized in cognitive abilities.  
To add to this, elephants have a great Encephalization Quotient (EQ). Encephalization is defined as the amount of brain mass related to an animal's total body mass. Elephants have an EQ of 1.87, which is pretty impressive.
