The SRM Youth Conclave 2024, which concluded on November 9, provided a platform for young minds to grapple with one of the most pressing issues of our time: the ongoing crisis in Gaza. Nearly 100 delegates from three visiting schools and the host school came together to simulate the workings of the United Nations General Assembly(UNGA), the United Nations Security Council (UNSC), and the United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC). Over the course of two days and four sessions, these budding diplomats debated, deliberated, and sought resolutions to address the humanitarian, security, and developmental challenges faced by the region. For seasoned participants, the conclave was an opportunity to showcase their expertise, while for first-timers, it was a steep learning curve that highlighted the complexities of international relations.

The Gaza crisis served as the focal point for all three committees, underscoring the event's commitment to fostering awareness and engagement with real-world issues.

UNGA: Delegates in this committee concentrated on the broader implications of the conflict, including international aid, rebuilding infrastructure, and fostering regional stability.

UNSC: As expected, the Security Council witnessed intense debates over the ongoing conflict, with delegates proposing measures to de-escalate tensions, enforce ceasefires, and promote dialogue between opposing factions.

UNHRC: This committee shed light on the humanitarian crisis, discussing violations of human rights, the plight of refugees, and the urgent need for international intervention to provide relief and safeguard the rights of civilians.

These discussions not only highlighted the interconnected nature of the crisis but also pushed delegates to consider multifaceted solutions. The event spanned four sessions, with two on each day. From opening speeches to unmoderated caucuses, every moment was marked by fervent discussions and persuasive arguments.
